

Information Systems Academic Conferences

There are three Information Systems academic conferences that students should consider applying to present their research findings (out of the hundreds of available conferences). The dates posted below may change and students should make sure that they are up-to-date with the latest schedules. Acceptance rates differ by conference and by track you submit your work to (ICIS is usually the hardest to get in to). Make sure you are aware of the paper submission dates and that you begin your research early enough to give yourself enough time to apply.
